The M1928 automatic machine gun designed by John Taliaferro Thompson in 1918 was adopted in 1938 by the United States Armed Forces serving during the Second World War and later in the Korean War as well as in the early cases of the Vietnam War. He was the favorite of soldiers, criminals, police and civilians for his ergonomics, compact size, reliability, high rate of fire in automatic mode and ammunition .45 ACP. It had a straight magazine of 20 cartridges or a magazine of 50 to 100 cartridges.

He gained a bad name at the time of Prohibition or the Dry Law in the United States (1920-1933). He normally appeared in the means of the time, when it was the favorite weapon of gangsters. He came to win nicknames like Trench Broom, Trench Sweeper, Chicago Typewriter, Chicago Piano, Chicago Style or The Chopper.

Since then, it has gained popularity among collectors because of its historical importance. Relive the era of dry law with this Denix replica of the M1928 submachine gun!
