Falling block mechanism: simplicity and reliability

The falling-block mechanism remains a benchmark in terms of robustness. Opening the block, manual loading, and extraction via the extractor offer simple and intuitive operation. This design encourages a deliberate firing rhythm, ideal for fully exploiting the **45-70 GOVT** with a controlled and consistent approach.

Canon 22-inch 45-70 GOVT

The choice of a short barrel combined with the **.45-70 GOVT** caliber gives this rifle a distinctive character. The 1:18 twist rate ensures good projectile stabilization, in line with traditional shooting practices. This is a well-suited configuration for those who appreciate authentic shooting experiences and specific reloading techniques.

Traditional finishes and hand-oiled wood

The color case instantly adds character, with its unique hues making each piece slightly different. The blued barrel completes the look with understated elegance, while the hand-oiled walnut stock and forend offer a warm and natural grip. On the shelf, it's a model that easily catches the eye.

Military-style open sight

The combination of a fixed front sight and a ladder rear sight adjustable for windage and elevation perfectly captures the spirit of the era. This simple and effective system allows for adapting the shot to different distances, while maintaining an experience faithful to historical standards.
