A faithful replica of a historical percussion rifle.

The **CHIAPPA Richmond 1862 .58 25" rifle** is a careful reproduction of an iconic Civil War model, operating with **percussion** and intended for **black powder shooting** and collecting.

- **Action:** Percussion (black powder)
- **Power supply:** Manual loading via the mouth
- **Material:** Steel
- **Stock:** Hand-oiled walnut
- **Finish:** White (polished white steel)
- **Sights:** Fixed front sight / Adjustable rear sight
- **Security:** None (historical design)

- **Caliber:** .58
- **Capacity:** 1 shot
- **Barrel length:** 25" (635 mm)
- **Weight:** 3.90 lb (? 1.77 kg)

A faithful reproduction of the 1862 model

Inspired by Richmond rifles produced during the American Civil War, this version respects the original lines: external percussion lock, understated metal fittings, and a straight walnut stock. The overall effect is one of immediate authenticity, whether displayed in a showcase or at the shooting range.

.58 caliber percussion operation

Chambered in **.58**, this rifle uses **black powder** and is percussion-ignited. It is muzzle-loaded, following the traditional method. This specific technique is an integral part of the experience of shooting historical firearms.

Canon 25" and traditional precision

The 25" (635 mm) barrel offers good stability and comfortable aiming. The adjustable rear sight allows for adapting the shot to the distance. When used within a suitable and regulated framework,

it allows for black powder shooting in accordance with the established disciplines.

Wood and White finish

The **hand-oiled walnut** stock adds warmth and authenticity. The **white** finish (polished white steel) highlights the mechanical lines and underscores the historical character of the weapon. Every detail contributes to the overall aesthetic.

FAQ

To which category does this rifle belong?

Muzzle-loading, percussion-fired black powder firearms are classified as category D in France. Their purchase is unrestricted for adults, in accordance with current regulations.

What type of ammunition does she use?

It operates with black powder and projectiles suitable for .58 caliber, with percussion cap priming. Use must comply with the specific recommendations for black powder firearms.

Is it suitable for sport shooting?

Yes, it can be used in black powder sport shooting, particularly in disciplines dedicated to historical weapons, in a suitable and compliant shooting range.
